Gathering

Confession and forgiveness (p. 94) or thanksgiving for baptism (p. 97) may begin the service.

Gathering Song

One or more of the following may be sung: hymns, psalms; a Kyrie; a canticle of praise.

During this time, the presiding minister and the assembly greet each other.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

And also with you.

A Kyrie may be sung in dialogue between an assisting minister and the assembly.



In peace, let us pray to the Lord.







Response after the announcement: Glory to you, O Lord. Response after the conclusion: Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

The assembly is seated. Silence for reflection follows the sermon.

Hymn of the Day

The assembly stands to proclaim the word of God in song.

Creed

The Nicene Creed (p. 104) or the Apostles' Creed (p. 105) may be spoken.

Prayers of Intercession

Each portion of the prayers ends with these or similar words.

OR

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

...let us pray.

Have mercy, O God.

Hear us, O God.

Your mercy is great.

Response at the conclusion of the prayers of intercession: Amen.


Peace

Response: **And also with you.** The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace and may say Peace be with you or similar words. Then the assembly is seated.


Meal

An offering is gathered, and the table is set. Assembly song or other music may accompany or follow the gathering of the offering. After the offering is gathered, the assembly stands. The gifts may be brought forward. An offering prayer may be said; the assembly responds **Amen.**

Great Thanksgiving



The thanksgiving continues with the preface for the day or season; the assembly responds:



The presiding minister continues, using an appropriate form.

The thanksgiving may include this acclamation.



The thanksgiving may include a sung Amen.



The great thanksgiving concludes:


Our Father in heaven,

Response after the blessing: Amen.

Sending Song

If "Now, Lord, you let your servant go in peace" was not sung at the end of communion, it may be sung here, or another sending song may be sung.

Dismissal

Response: Thanks be to God.
